ToT on 03.06.25 & 04.06.25 for Sanitary Inspectors:

In the 1st batch ToT, all Sanitary Inspectors were invited to participate, out of 67 SIs, 62 number of Sis participated in the ToT. The program was inaugurated by Hon'ble Mayor, Smt. Sulochana Das in presence of Dr. Kamal Lochan Mishra, IAS, Executive Director, OSDMA, Sj. Ratnakar Sahu, Addl. Commissioner, BMC, Sj. Kailash Chandra Das, Addl. Commissioner, BMC and Ms. Rashmirekha Amanta, Deputy Commissioner (Emergency), BMC. Sri Sachidananda Pati, CPC, OSDMA-BMC coordinated with program and resource person from OSDMA, Fire Service along with BMC imparted the training to the Participants.



Addl. Commissioner, BMC welcomed all the participants and briefed about the program to the participants followed by the inaugural address by Dr. Kamal Lochan Mishra, IAS, ED, OSDMA.

ED, OSDMA emphasised on the preparedness which was followed and cultured after the Super Cyclone 1999 which has paved our path in disaster management till date. Further, elaborated on how the trainings, capacity building programmes, planning in different levels starting from Village to State, equipping the Fire Service with ultramodern equipment, formation of ODRAF (Odisha Disaster Rapid Action Force) units in different strategic places, quick response in case of both human induced and natural disasters helped the state of Odisha became no-1 in disaster management. Odisha not only praised nationally but also praised internationally for its robust disaster management initiatives. ED, uttered that incidents are there for extending our support & service in case of Kerala floods,



during AMPHAN Cyclone in West Bengal, supply of Oxygen to other states i.e. Delhi & Mumbai during COVID-19 etc. Odisha has its own robust Warning Dissemination System in Coastal areas to face the TSUNAMI disaster. ED, OSDMA ended with a remark that as per the new amendment in Disaster Management Act 2005, Urban Disaster Management Authority

likely to be formed in near future under the active supervision of Commissioner. Which definitely a step towards institutionalising the Disaster Management in Corporation level. ED, OSDMA further said that the people of Odisha already accepted the disaster management in a part and parcel of their life.

Hon'ble Mayor in her inaugural address shared that she has seen how Govt. of Odisha prioritized the Disaster management after the devastation of Super Cyclone 1999. Hon'ble Mayor shared that as she has started her carrier as a journalist, she was completely aware of the progress & path followed by GoO in disaster management,



how the cyclone shelters were built in coastal belts, how all community members were involved in different life saving training programs, how the people used to practise the mock drill every year, how evacuations were done past years, how different milestones achieved till date etc. to the participants. She has also appreciated the effort of OSDMA for brining such type of training programs / initiatives in BMC area for smooth disaster management which is a welcome step.


- a. Coordinate with Emergency section for finalisation of dates for filed level orientation programs
 - b. Coordinate with Fire service and mobilise the participants for attending the program at ward level
 - c. Act as a co-trainer at the time of activity at the Slums / RWAs etc. along with Fire Service
 - d. Monitor, submit a report on the activities such as awareness campaigns, street plays etc. carried out in different places under their jurisdiction / wards
 - e. Act as a focal point for fire safety related awareness activities at the ward level
6. The session was completely participatory and all the trainees participated fully during the discussion.

Session – II: Basic Concept & Institutional Mechanism of Disaster Management

Sri Gouri Sankar Mishra, State Project Officer, OSDMA has conducted a session on Basic concepts & Institutional Mechanism of Disaster Management in a participatory approach. The trainees made to understand about the following:



1. What is Hazard, Risk, vulnerability, exposure, capacity, Disaster?



2. What is Disaster Management?

3. What is the human induced and natural Disasters?

4. What are the disasters covered under SDRF, centrally declared disasters and state specific disasters?

5. What is Disaster Management Cycle and implementation of DM 2005?


6. What is Prevention, Mitigation, Response, Relief,

Preparedness, Rehabilitation, Reconstruction, Recovery, Resilience etc.?

All the above points were discussed with different examples so that the trainees can understand easily. In the same session, Institutional Mechanism of Disaster Management was also discussed.

Resource person makes the trainees understand about the flow chart mentioned here.

He has also emphasised on the Institutional arrangement made in Odisha to meet any eventuality. The same is given here.



Session – III: Disaster Survival Skills

The master trainers from DMTC (Disaster Management Training Cell, SIDM) Sri. Prabhudatta Padhee, Sri Kanhu Charan Hembram & Sri Basanta Kumar Nayak imparted the training on Disaster survival skills to the participants. Basically, aim was to given the participants some idea how they will look after themselves in emergency situation along with their own assigned emergency work. They were taught about the following:



- The survival skill and survival psychology.
- How much prepare we are?
- The individual and family level Disaster preparedness.
- The survival Rule of 3 and panic control.
- The four steps for disaster preparedness.
- The survival procedure from different type of disaster.
- Know basics of BLS & Emergency methods of rescue.

The above points were discussed elaborately in a participatory mode and basing upon real life examples. A drill was also conducted for earthquake i.e. "**Drop, Cover, and Hold On**" and **Lighting Safety Posture (LSP)** by the participants.

Day -2:

Session – I: Disaster Management Initiatives in Odisha

A session Disaster Management Initiatives was conducted by Sri Sachidananda Pati, CPC, OSDMA-BMC, which was emphasised on

- Disaster Management Planning at all level,
- Temporary Shelter Management during the event,
- Early Warning Dissemination to the last mile and
- use of SATARK App to get appropriate warning in right time.

The participants were also orientated how to download the SATARK app form Google Play store and how it is beneficial to them.

Session – II & III: Basics of Fire and its safety, Fire Prevention at Home & Fire Prevention at Market or malls.

A detailed session was conducted by Sri Alok Kumar Biswal, Station Officer, Baramunda Fire Station on Basics of Fire & its safety, Fire Prevention at Home & Fire Prevention at Market or malls. He elaborated the following during the session:

- What is Fire?
- Different types of Fire.
- Methods of transmission of heat.
- How to extinguish fire?
- Common causes of fire Hazards.
- Different types of Fire Extinguisher & its operation.
- Ways used in combating Fire-related Disasters.



Complete participatory session was conducted with proper interaction with the participants. Participants were to understand the use of fire extinguishers at home as well as those who while entering to any shopping mall.

Session IV: Demonstration and Hands on training for handling the fire extinguishers.

A team from Kalpana Fire Station lead by Sri Sridhar Rout was invited to do the fire safety demonstration in the second half of the day 2 training program. The team explained about different types of fire extinguishers and their use. Further, explained about the kitchen fire and how the LPG cylinder can be handled at home in case of fire. All the participants participated and learned how to use those instruments during fire.



Session V: Valediction

Valedictory session was conducted in presence of Additional Commissioner, BMC and Deputy commissioner BMC. All the participants were felicitated with the certificate of participation in the training program. The training was come to end with a pledge we will definitely serve the people with more effectively during any kind of emergency.




